Covid-19 is still circulating throughout our community. If your student has symptoms of illness, please contact our office. Testing is available onsite and we can also provide take home testing kits from InteliSwab.

Testing Kit Information:

Please note this test takes 30 minutes to complete.

- Keep the test stand for all tests in the box. You will need to use it for the second test.
- Use the easy to follow pictures and instructions inside the box on how to do the test.
- When used for children, the test should be performed by an adult.
- For those 14 years and below: slowly circle the swab in EACH nostril at least 4 times while g against the inside of the nostril. This should take about 15 seconds.
- For those above the age of 15: Swab each nostril, circling at least 15 times.

Implementing the SCUSD School Wellness Policy

"SCUSD passed the Wellness Board Policy 5030, which is an important tool for promoting student wellness, preventing and reducing childhood obesity, and assuring that school meal nutrition guidelines meet the minimum federal school meals standards. The policy contains goals specifically for nutrition promotion and education, physical activity, and other school based activities that promote student wellness." Please adhere to these guidelines, along with our Student/Parent Handbook Snack/Recess Procedures (page 20) that prohibit candy, soda, etc. Below is information from SCUSD's brochure regarding the Wellness Policy, including classroom celebrations.

What is a Wellness Policy?

"A Wellness Policy is an important tool for parents, educational agencies and school districts in promoting student wellness, preventing and reducing childhood obesity, and assuring that school meal nutrition guidelines meet the minimum federal school meals standards. It contains goals specifically for nutrition promotion and education, physical activity, and other school based activities that promote student wellness." -USDA



Who Created SCUSD's Wellness Policy?

A group of caring and concerned parents/ guardians, students, nutrition service employees, physical education teachers, school health professionals, board members, administrators, and members of the public joined together to form the SCUSD Wellness Committee, and write the policy. The committee meets monthly and welcomes new members!



What may be served & sold on campus?

Foods and beverages served and sold in schools must meet strict federal and state regulations for calories, saturated fat, sodium, sugar, and trans fat. For an easy-to-use list, visit www.scusd.edu/wellnesspolicy.

When are these regulations in effect?

PreK-8th grade:

Regulations are effective from midnight to a half hour after the school day or expanded learning (whichever is later).

High schools

Regulations are effective from midnight to a half hour after the school day.

How can you tell which foods are compliant?

Other than fresh fruits and vegetables, which are always compliant, food compliance varies widely. Use the California Project Lean calculator to determine compliance of items: www.californiaprojectlean.org

To whom do these regulations apply?

These federal and state regulations apply to Non-Charter Public Schools participating in the National School Lunch Program.

Fundraising Regulations

School student-organizations must comply with all food and beverage standards. This includes how many items they can sell, preapproval of the items, when they can sell, how many sales can be done per year, and more.

Classroom Celebrations

SCUSD employees, parent organizations, and outside organizations will not use any food or beverage as a reward, incentive, or punishment for academic performance or good behavior.

Schools can promote a positive learning environment by shifting the focus from food during classroom celebrations, and striving to have non-food celebrations or healthy non-allergenic food. Food must be compliant with Competitive Foods regulations.

Healthy snack options:


- Fresh fruit

ELECTRONIC USE POLICY REMINDER



Cell phones, Apple Watches and Smart Watches are allowed on school campus, but must remain in the student's backpack and be turned off during school hours, per SCUSD policy.

Students may use phones on the way to and from school, however, cell phones must be turned off and put away when students enter campus. Cell phones, I-pods, or any other electronic devices are not allowed at recess. Students caught with a cell phone or electronic device while at school will have the device taken away and kept in the office for safekeeping until a parent/guardian can pick it up. In some classes it may be necessary for the teacher to collect and then return cell phones each day. In an emergency situation a student may be allowed to use a cell phone to contact a parent with specific information provided by the school, with the permission of staff. Students are not allowed to take pictures or video on campus using cell phones or any other electronic device. Cyber bullying and harassment are not tolerated and will be addressed on a case by case basis per the education code. The school encourages parents to actively monitor their child's engagement with social media so as to prevent inappropriate behavior.

ENROLLMENT INFORMATION

To qualify to register for TK, students must be 5 years of age September 2, 2023, through April 2, 2024 and live within the Sacramento City Unified School District boundaries. Applications can be submitted online at www.scusd.edu/tk.



SCHOOL CHOICE

Enter your address into School Finder at www.scusd.edu/school-finder, to find your neighborhood school and/or the closest TK program.

Families can choose to apply to any TK location, but priority for school selection is the following:

- Students who reside within the selected school boundaries* and/or is the closest TK location to their primary residence.
- Siblings of students already in attendance at the selected school and will continue to be enrolled in the upcoming school year.
- 3. Students whose parent/guardian's primary place of employment is the selected school.

*A.M. Winn, Alice Birney and Leonardo da Vinci schools are schools of choice and do not have neighborhood boundaries. Applicants to these programs will not receive priority based on location.

SCHOOLS WITH ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS

Applicants to one of the TK & Head Start/California State Preschool collaborations (Edward Kemble, Ethel Phillips, Earl Warren, Isador Cohen, John Bidwell, Mark Twain, Martin Luther King, Jr; Parkway, and Susan B. Anthony) must meet income eligibility guidelines to qualify. For more information contact the Early Childhood and Care Department at (916) 395-5500.

A.M. Winn, Alice Birney and Leonardo da Vinci schools require an adult representative (parent/guardian) to attend a school visitation and complete a student interest form in order to qualify. Please contact the schools directly for more information.

LOTTERY AND REGISTRATION

A lottery must be implemented if applications exceed the grade capacity at the requested school. Enrollment will be based on lottery results held in May 2023. Enrollment at the school of residence is not guaranteed. After the lottery, families will be notified of their application's status. Families will either be offered placement or put on a waitlist for their requested school. Families that are offered placement will have to complete the registration process with the Enrollment Center. If a qualified student is on the waitlist for a school, the District will identify a seat at the nearest school site with space available. No qualifying student will be denied a spot into Transitional Kindergarten.

Applications that are received after the May 2023 lottery, will be processed based on space availability at the time of the application.

BEFORE AND AFTER SCHOOL CARE

Families who are interested in having their TK student in Sac City Unified's Expanded Learning program will be given priority. Registration will be available at www.youthdevelopmentscusd.org starting in March 2023.
